

THE BEST ADVICE AND GUIDANCE

Our focus on Progression and Futures really puts this front and centre for our Sixth Form. We have a dedicated Head of Progression and Futures whose role it is to ensure that every student receives the personalised advice and guidance they need to succeed in their future beyond school.

As part of the GDST family, Croydon High benefits from an extensive network of alumnae who are available to provide advice and information to our pupils. Our alumnae are impressive women with strong voices who are industry leaders and who are also committed to supporting future generations of girls in learning about their sector and their journey within it.

There are several platforms where pupils can gain direct access to our alumnae.

- GDST Life offers pupils the opportunity to connect with alumnae who work in the fields in which they are interested, and there are a number of career-specific groups on the platform. GDST Life also provides access to a range of virtual events hosted acorss the GDST.
- Rungway gives pupils the opportunity to ask questions more informally and receive an answer directly from an alumna with relevant experience.
- We also benefit from Ivy Link, our own network of Croydon High alumnae which provides a pool of willing mentors and supporters.
- By using these networks, our pupils are really able to "be who they see".







Croydon High has teamed up with other GDST schools to launch Limitless Learning. This programme connects GDST pupils across the country who have the same ambitions and who are on the same journey. It provides the best of all our schools beamed onto their screens, delivering initiatives designed to support and enhance our pupils' studies in sixth form, and help them 'bridge' to university study.

GDST teachers are talented and supportive and Limitless Learning allows our pupils to learn from more of them and benefit from their expertise. It brings together our pupils, their school, and their 24 sister schools, all working together to offer them every opportunity to stand out in the future.

We have a comprehensive library of careers-related books and can provide direction for pupils looking for information online, whether about university courses, apprenticeships or careers. We encourage our pupils to be proactive in finding this information, and to take control of their own futures, while providing the support and expertise to enable them to do so.

A TAILORED APPROACH FOR EACH STUDENT

Croydon High alumnae are out in the world demonstrating how a GDST education, and the opportunities it affords, can put pupils in an incredibly strong position to succeed in their chosen careers.

Pupils benefit from regular 1-2-1 sessions with the Head of Progression and Futures, and other members of the Sixth Form Team, to discuss their career aspirations and ambitions for the future.


Each student is allocated a "Personal Adviser" in Year 9, who stays with them through to Year 11, providing advice, supporting them on their journey to Sixth Form and acting as their champion within the school.

Our Pathways mentoring programme provides each student with an individual mentor to help them take control of their own progression, explore their options for the future, and support them to achieve their ambitions. Pathways bridges the gap between sixth form and university or an apprenticeship, and ultimately, working life.

Our mentors have been selected because of real-world experience in a particular career, or related subject expertise, providing tailored insight for the pupils. Pathways mentors also have access to the extensive GDST alumnae networks, through which they can connect pupils with alumnae working in the fields they are exploring.

Pathways is flexible enough to support those pupils who have a clear idea of where they are heading, and those who are still thinking about the path they might want to pursue. For those who are committed to a specific path, like Medicine or Law, Pathways provides targeted support to make sure they have the best possible application. Those who are less sure we expose to a wide range of opportunities and experiences to guide them on their journey to choosing the best path.
