CONDITIONS OF PERFORMANCE SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS

Standard Terms and Conditions:

The Scholarship/Award Conditions are supplemental to and should be read in conjunction with the Girls' Day School Trust ("GDST") Terms and Conditions. Terms defined in the GDST Terms and Conditions shall have the same meaning in the Scholarship/Award Conditions unless the context requires otherwise.

1. Obligations of the pupil:

A pupil who is the subject of a Scholarship/Award is required to work hard, to contribute positively to the life of the School, to be a credit to the School and to set a good example to other pupils.

A pupil who is subject of a **Performance Scholarship/Award** is expected to play a leading role in the School's Art/Drama/Music or sporting activities. Roles and Responsibilities are detailed on the reverse of the Performance Scholarship Terms and Conditions.

2. Obligations of the Parent/s:

Parents are expected to support and encourage their daughter to achieve the purposes of the Scholarship/Award and to uphold the aims and the excellent reputation of the School.

3. Withdrawal of the Scholarship/Award:

The Scholarship/Award may be withdrawn at the discretion of the Headmistress if, in the opinion of the Headmistress, the pupil or a parent has not complied with the obligations set out above or otherwise the pupil has fallen below the required standards of conduct and work, one term's notice will be given for withdrawal of the Scholarship/Award. Additionally, exclusion of a pupil may lead to an immediate withdrawal of the Scholarship/Award.

4. Review of the Scholarship/Award:

At the end of each academic year, the Headmistress will review the achievement and progress made by the pupil. The Scholarship/Award may be withdrawn by written notice sent to the parent if, in her opinion, the pupil's performance has fallen below the standard required by the Scholarship/Award.

5. Fees in lieu of notice:

For the avoidance of doubt, where fees in lieu of notice are due this will be full fees for a school term with no allowance for Scholarship/Award.

6. Scholarship Duration

The Scholarship will normally be tenable until a pupil leaves Croydon High School, except in the case of Art if a pupil does not study to GCSE or A Level. In this case the Scholarship ceases at the end of Year 9 or 11. Music/Sport/Drama provide opportunities and responsibilities outside of the curriculum through to Year 13.

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Sixth Form Sports Scholarship Roles And Responsibilities

Key stage 5 - Sixth Form

Sports Scholarship Roles and Responsibilities

In Key stage 5 a pupil who is the subject of a Sports scholarship award is expected to play a leading part in the School's sporting activities. This includes:-

- Representing a minimum of 1 winter and 1 summer activity.
- Taking an active role in leading clubs in both the junior and senior school.
- Assisting with team organisation, captaining teams involved in herself.
- Keeping PE notice boards up to date with team sheets and competition information.
- Improving communication between teams and staff in assisting with team organisation.
- Writing and presenting the PE subject report at end of each academic year at prize-giving ceremonies.
